### Azle General Election Cancelled

Each candidate for the May 6, 2017 City of Azle General Election is unopposed. The Texas Election Code authorizes a governing body to declare each unopposed candidate “elected to office” and may cancel the election. Therefore, at the March 7, 2017 Azle City Council meeting, Council approved an ordinance cancelling the General Election. The following “unopposed” candidates were declared “elected to office” and will take an Oath of Office in May:

- Mayor —Alan Brundrett
- Councilmember Place 3—Bill Jones
- Councilmember Place 4—Christopher Simpson
- Councilmember Place 6—Lee Barrett

### City upgrading water meters to cellular-based meter reading system

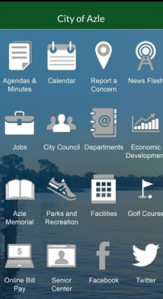


On April 6, the City of Azle began upgrading all water meters to a cellular-based meter reading system. This new system will allow water meters to be read remotely using cellular-based technology that will interface directly with the City’s utility billing system. This change will increase efficiency, improve leak detection, and allow the City to provide better service to our customers.

The contract for this system was awarded to Atlas Utility Supply Company. US Bronco Services will be responsible for installing the new water meters and equipment. They will be in neighborhoods beginning April 6 and their vehicles will be clearly marked.

The City of Azle, in partnership with Community Waste Disposal (CWD), will be conducting a **FREE** city-wide clean-up. Residents can drop off brush, furniture, bulky items, appliances, metal for recycling and small amounts of construction materials from do-it-yourself projects.

CWD will be on site to collect Household Hazardous Waste (paints, chemicals, cleaners, used motor oil and batteries), E\*waste (computers, printers, electronic devices, old television sets), used tires and a document shredder will be on site.



We ask that you pre-sort as much as possible; this will help keep traffic moving and allow staff to work as efficiently as possible. This is a *free* event for Azle residents and proof of Azle residency will be required by presenting your utility bill and driver's license.

**Items Not Accepted:** Ammunition, asbestos, boats, building materials, butane cylinders, explosives, medical waste, PCBs, propane cylinders, radioactive material, and smoke detectors.

## 2016 Annual Drinking Water Quality Report

The Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) is a regulation, passed by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as part of the 1996 Safe Drinking Water Act Amendments, requiring all community water systems to provide customers with an annual water quality report. This is the Annual Drinking Water Report for the period January 1 to December 31, 2016. With the CCR, communities obviously benefit by acquiring a better understanding of water suppliers and the processes involved, which allows them an opportunity to make informed decisions regarding their use of drinking water. This report is a summary of the quality of water we provide our customers. The CCR also provides the City of Azle with an opportunity to explain how the community's drinking water supplies are protected. ## Fitch raises City of Azle credit rating to 'AA'

Fitch Ratings has upgraded the City of Azle's credit ratings to 'AA' from 'AA-' on general obligation refunding bonds (GOs) and certificates of obligation (COs). Fitch is one of three (3) rating agencies (along with Standard & Poors and Moody's). The upgrade to 'AA' reflects the application of Fitch's revised criteria for U.S. state and local governments, released on April 18, 2016. The revised criteria highlight the city's exceptionally strong financial operations, solid expenditure flexibility and a low long-term liability burden. The rating also incorporates the city's substantial independent ability to raise revenues, and strong revenue growth prospects resulting from continued tax base expansion. Azle has demonstrated a strong commitment to enhancing its financial flexibility. Budgeting is conservative, and management has been proactive in maintaining operational balance throughout economic cycles.
