



Azle Memorial Library Frequently Asked Questions Downloadable eAudiobooks and eBooks

Where does Azle Memorial Library get its downloadable materials?

The Azle Library Trust provided funds for the Azle Memorial Library to join the North Texas OverDrive consortium, also known as North Texas Libraries on the Go. OverDrive is the company that produces materials in digital format and the software needed to download and use digital formats on your computer and portable devices.

What's the difference between a downloadable eAudiobook and a downloadable eBook?

Downloadable eAudiobooks are recordings of the book being read, usually by an actor or other professional performer. Downloadable eBooks are reproductions of the printed books that are designed to be read on electronic readers, such as the Sony Reader, the Amazon Kindle, and the Barnes and Noble NOOK.

What equipment and software do I need to access downloadable eAudiobooks?

You will need an Internet-connected computer with the OverDrive Media Console software installed. There are versions available for Windows® 98 SE (or newer) and Mac OS® v10.4.9 (or newer). This software is free for download at <http://www.overdrive.com/software/omc/>. You will also need Windows Media Player 9 Series (or newer) for computers running Windows and iTunes v7.6.2.9 (or newer) for Macs. Transferring to a Zune® requires the Zune application and Zune firmware v3.0 or newer.

You will download eAudiobooks from the North Texas Libraries on the Go website, or directly from the Overdrive App (available free in the iTunes® or Google Play® Stores.)

Will I be able to use the computers at the library to download eAudiobooks and eBooks?

Not at this time. However, we are happy to provide demonstrations showing how to download materials.

What portable devices work with OverDrive downloadable eAudiobooks?

Many different devices are supported. At www.ntexlibrariesonthego.org, click the 'Help' link at the right side of the page, then on the 'Getting Started' section to see if a particular device has been verified to work with OverDrive.

How many downloadable eAudiobooks are available?

As of the date of this publication, 4,910 OverDrive eAudiobooks are available.

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How many downloadable eBooks are available?

As of the date of this publication, 10,108 eBooks are available.

Can I download eAudiobooks directly to my portable player?

If you have one of the following operating systems on your Internet-enabled portable player, you can download eAudiobooks directly to your device after downloading the OverDrive Media Console application (available at <http://www.overdrive.com/software/omc/>): Android v1.5 (or newer), BlackBerry v4.5 (or newer), iPhone® (and iPad) iOS v4.0 (or newer), Windows Mobile® 5 and 6.

What do I need to sign up for an OverDrive account?

You will need a valid Azle Memorial Library card. You will not be able to check out downloadable titles from Overdrive if your account is blocked for overdue materials, fines or fees. Please contact the Library or if you have trouble logging into www.ntexlibrariesonthego.org.

How many items will I be able to check out at one time?

You will be able to check out three downloadable items at one time.

Will I be able to request items if they are checked out?

Yes. You will be able to place hold requests for up to three items items at a time.

How long will I have to listen to/view my downloads?

For most items, you will be able to choose a checkout period of seven days or fourteen days. Most items will not allow renewals. However, if no one else has an item on hold, the option to renew might be available. If an item you are reading expires and renewal was not an option, you may check the item back out again, or place the item on hold.

Can I return checked out items early?

In most cases you will be able to return items early. The menu option to return your item varies based on the device you are using. When doing so, be sure that you are selecting the option to "return" the item, and not just deleting it from your device. There may be titles that are not allowed to be returned early based on publisher and licensing restrictions.

Are there late fees on downloadable materials?

No. OverDrive digital downloads are protected with digital rights management (DRM) software and will become locked and unusable after your checkout period expires. You will not have to do anything to "turn in" your downloaded materials, but you will have to delete old files from your computer and portable devices.
